## WHY YOU SHOULD PLAN AHEAD

The cost of a funeral can become a major burden if not anticipated. Funeral costs paid by the family or estate are significant and outlays can total \$12,500 to \$14,500 at the time of the funeral, with further outlays for the monument typically during the following year. Funeral costs include a component to help cover Tahara, Chapel and other Brisbane Chevra Kadisha costs. While this component is reduced for members (5 years continuous), overall costs remain high as can be seen in the table further below.

In the Brisbane Jewish Community, funerals are coordinated by your Chevra Kadisha and supported by George Hartnett Metropolitan Funerals, Kelvin Grove. Funerals are held at Jewish section 4C at Brisbane City Council's Mt Gravatt Cemetery – at the Chevra Kadisha Chapel and at the graveside.

Pre-planning can help to spread and reduce funeral costs. Burial plots can be pre-purchased through Mt Gravatt Cemetery (with Brisbane Chevra Kadisha written pre-authorisation). Funerals can be pre-paid. The Guardian Funeral Plan, embraced by the Australian industry, and available through George Hartnett Metropolitan Funerals, Kelvin Grove, provides for prepayment fixed at today's prices regardless of when the funeral is held.

#### **STONEMASON FEES**

Mt Gravatt Jewish Section 4C is a **monumental cemetery** governed by Brisbane City Council and Brisbane Chevra Kadisha rules. While many stonemasons can operate in Council cemeteries, your Chevra Kadisha has worked closely with Jones & Travers (MMS Memorials) for decades. This relationship facilitates responsiveness, accuracy (eg Hebrew), consistency, quality and fair pricing. Unfortunately, Covid and Russia's war on Ukraine have resulted in increased freight times and charges and this has flowed through into higher monument costs.

- Oversee property, equipment and volunteers including appropriate insurances.
